Course description:	Business Law, as a course of study, provides an introduction to companies under the applicable laws in Kosovo. This course will explain the main concepts of the Law on Business Organizations that regulate business activities in Kosovo. A detailed analysis will also be devoted to the laws, legal acts on which business law operates.
Course objectives:	The purpose of this course is to provide students with knowledge of customs law which they will be able to use in the course of customs procedures. The customs system in every country, through customs policy, is permanently in function of economic development. The implementation of customs policy, as part of the fiscal policy of an economic system, in modern countries depends on and relies on the functioning of customs institutes and instruments. This circumstance is also present in the Customs and Excise Code of the Republic of Kosovo. The objectives of this course relate to acquiring deeper knowledge of the customs system, customs policies as part of the fiscal policy of the country concerned and customs procedures.
Learning outcomes:	Upon completion of the Business Law course, students will have sufficient knowledge of business law, particularly in the two main pillars, such as legal

aspects and institutions. Regarding the legal aspect, students will learn about the primary and secondary legal sources that regulate this field. Such as International Agreements or Treaties, Kosovo Constitution, Laws, Statutes, Regulations, Orders, Decisions etc. Institutionally, they will learn, inter alia, about the competencies and procedures for dealing with commercial nature disputes by the Commercial Department within the Basic Court of Pristina, Kosovo Business Registration Agency, Kosovo Chamber of Commerce, Arbitration Tribunal, etc.
