The overall aim of the course is for students to attain basic knowledge of the EU legal system, which will focus on theoretical and scientific knowledge related to a wide range of organizational and functional legal relationships in the social and economic life of this supranational organization. Although the course is only one semester, students will have the opportunity to familiarize themselves with this field and critically analyze and compare with the legal and economic developments in the EU and beyond, but will also get acquainted with some theoretical issues and problems with which researchers confront this field.

Various and large developments in different forms and content, states and other international acts in the field of law and economics, particularly in the EU, require adequate responses and finding new and prospective routes in bilateral and multilateral state relations, which will also be part of the review in this course. The interest in an integration into the European family, in accordance with contemporary legal provisions based on market economy and globalization conditions, are an integral and permanent part of the study in the legal framework. In this direction, the subject of the study will be the integration events related to Kosovo. All this will be an effort for elementary knowledge in this area.

Expected learning outcomes

After completing the course, the student shall:

- be familiar with the history and development of the European Union, the institutions of the European Union, the sources of EU law and the policy-making process;
- have knowledge of the extent and limits of the powers of the European Union, including central principles and the role of EU courts, the position, reception, and enforcement of EU law in the Member States;
- knows the conditions and criteria that need to be fulfilled by candidate countries for EU member states;
- Kosovo and the European integration challenges;
- be able, orally and in writing, to identify, explain, analyze and evaluate EU law
