Course description	<p>This course will provide students with a basic knowledge of understanding diplomatic and consular relations: the notion and different theories of diplomacy; the history of diplomacy; establishment of diplomatic missions, diplomatic privileges and immunities; the establishment and operation of consular missions, their privileges and immunities; diplomatic correspondence; foreign service of the Republic of Kosovo; diplomatic protocol; European Union diplomacy, etc.</p> <p>In addition, students will be provided with practical examples of the establishment and operation of diplomatic and consular missions; practical case law on diplomatic and consular privileges and immunities, in order to understand analytically the functioning and problems of representation of states in other countries.</p>
Course objectives:	<p>The basic purpose of the lectures with students from the subject: Diplomatic and Consular Law is the preparation of students of law faculty to be able to understand the notion of diplomacy, theories on diplomacy and the art of diplomacy. A special interest will be also the history of diplomacy from antiquity to modern times.</p> <p>Also, law students in this subject will have the opportunity to acquire knowledge from diplomatic correspondence as well as diplomatic practices of foreign countries; the activity of diplomatic and consular missions; permanent missions to international organizations, as well as the external service of</p>

	<p>states, their functions; Important parts are state bodies that are responsible for diplomatic and consular missions and representing states in relation to other countries, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs; The central part of this course is the Diplomatic and Consular Immunities and Privileges. Handling of practical cases also plays an important role in this course. Through this course, students will be able to benefit from the basic knowledge of Diplomatic and Consular Law, to give you the opportunity to gain a clear understanding of the functioning of the Diplomatic and Consular Missions, their Rights and Duties, to understand the role and importance of representation of states in other countries.</p>
